

If you normally receive Holy Communion, you are welcome to do so today: please come forward as directed, and maintain a distance of at least 2 metres between yourself and the person in front of you. Please stand to receive the Sacrament, which, at present, will be given in the hand only: face masks and gloves must be removed to receive the Blessed Sacrament. After you have received Holy Communion, please return to your seat by the outer aisles. If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, please remain in your seat.

Please stand for the Prayer after Communion, and say **Amen** at the end.

THE CONCLUDING RITES

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

All: And with your spirit.

Bishop: May almighty God bless you,
the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Bishop: Go forth, the Mass is ended.

All: Thanks be to God.

*The Priest venerates the Altar, and sings the Angelus (please **do not** join in the singing).*

Organ Voluntary: *Grand Choeur in B Flat* by Theodore Dubois

Please leave the church building as directed, sanitizing your hands before you do so. If you wish to listen to the Organ Voluntary, please remain seated, and leave when it has finished.

Candles may be lit before Mass only: this is to avoid congestion at the shrines while people are receiving Holy Communion or leaving the building.

Please maintain a 2 metres' distance between yourself and others at all times.

*Welcome to Mass. During the current pandemic, in order to worship safely, several protocols and restrictions have been introduced. Please join in the parts of the Mass in **bold type**, but please **do not sing** with the Priest, as congregational singing is not permitted at this time. Please follow all other directions given on this sheet.*

Please stand when the bell rings.

Bishop: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

Bishop: Peace be with you.

All: And with your spirit.

The Bishop introduces the Mass, and invites us to call to mind our sins.

**All: I confess to almighty God,
and to you my brothers and sisters,
that I have greatly sinned,
in my thoughts and in my words,
in what I have done
and in what I have failed to do,**

All strike their breast, saying:

**through my fault, through my fault,
through my most grievous fault;**

Then they continue:

**therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin,
all the Angels and Saints,
and you, my brothers and sisters,
to pray for me to the Lord our God.**

Bishop: May almighty God have mercy on us,
forgive us our sins,
and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.

*The Priest sings the Kyrie Eleison, Gloria in Excelsis and Collect (please **do not** join in the singing, but say **Amen** at the end of the Collect).*

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Please see the sheet for the readings and their responses: please sit for the first two readings and Psalm, and stand for the Gospel reading.

Please sit for the sermon, and stand for the Creed.

All: I believe in one God,
the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all things visible and invisible.
I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God,
born of the Father before all ages.
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
consubstantial with the Father;
through him all things were made.
For us men and for our salvation
he came down from heaven,

Bow and by the Holy Spirit
was incarnate of the Virgin Mary,
and became man.

For our sake he was crucified
under Pontius Pilate,
he suffered death and was buried,
and rose again on the third day
in accordance with the Scriptures.
He ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand
of the Father.

He will come again in glory
to judge the living and the dead
and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son
is adored and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic
and apostolic Church.
I confess one Baptism
for the forgiveness of sins
and I look forward
to the resurrection of the dead
and the life of the world to come. **Amen.**

Please sit for the Offertory, and stand to be censed. The usual collection will not be taken at this point: please put your envelopes and cash offerings into the wall safe immediately inside the door, marked 'Donations for the Work of the Church'. This can be done before Mass or before leaving the building. Thank you.

Bishop: Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours
may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands
for the praise and glory of his name,
for our good, and the good of all his holy Church.

The Priest sings the Prayer over the Offerings, to which all say Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

All: **And with your spirit.**

Bishop: Lift up your hearts.

All: **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Bishop: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: **It is right and just.**

The Bishop sings the Preface, the Sanctus and Benedictus. (Please do not join in the singing.)

The Bishop continues the Eucharistic Prayer. After he has shown the Chalice to the people, he genuflects and says:

Bishop: The mystery of faith.

All: **We proclaim your Death, O Lord,
and profess your Resurrection
until you come again.**

At the end of the Eucharistic Prayer, all respond Amen.

THE COMMUNION RITE

Bishop: At the Saviour's command, and formed by divine
teaching, we dare to say:

All: **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.**

Bishop: Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil,
graciously grant peace in our days,
that, by the help of your mercy,
we may be always free from sin
and safe from all distress,
as we await the blessed hope
and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

All: **For the kingdom, the power, and the glory
are yours, now and for ever.**

Bishop: Lord Jesus Christ, who said to your Apostles:
Peace I leave you, my peace I give you,
look not on our sins,
but on the faith of your Church,
and graciously grant her peace and unity
in accordance with your will.
Who live and reign for ever and ever.

All: **Amen.**

Bishop: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

All: **And with your spirit.**

Please do not exchange the Peace with each other.

The Priest sings the Agnus Dei (please do not join in the singing).

Bishop: Behold the Lamb of God,
behold him who takes away the sins of the world.
Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

All: **Lord, I am not worthy
that you should enter under my roof,
but only say the word
and my soul shall be healed.**

Bishop: The Body of Christ.

All: **Amen.**

The Bishop receives Holy Communion, sanitizes his hands, puts on a face mask and moves to the Chancel step for the distribution.
